


# WeChat norms- see the handbook

- 1. Be mindful of your audience/group and respect their feelings.
- 2. Refrain from "chatting" with one or two people in a group. Use private messages where possible.
- 3. Avoid gossip. Use the WeChat group to talk TO people, not ABOUT people. Never post negative messages about another member of the HIS community.
- 4. Send necessary messages and simple responses. If your message is complicated, use email or direct conversation.
- 5. Refrain from posting memes or emojis.
- 6. Evaluate the usefulness of your messages to others does everyone really need to know?
- 7. Check your information before you hit 'send' Is your information accurate and reliable?
- 8. Do not send messages when you are angry or confused.
- 9. Don't post anything you would feel uncomfortable saying to a person's face, including to your child's teacher or coach.
- 10. Avoid debate and argument WeChat is not the right forum for it.
- 11. Be aware of your tone in any message you send; tone can be misinterpreted easily.
- 12. Avoid sarcasm.
- 13. Do not use profanity or any words/phrases/information that should not be used in a family environment.
- 14. Don't assume your group chat is private it is not.
- 15. Keep your posts short and to the point.
- 16. Be a good role model to your children in your use of WeChat groups.





1. English Language and Literature + Chinese Language and Literature

Equally strong English and Chinese skills in all four areas (speaking, listening, reading and writing)

2. English Language and Literature + Chinese Language B

English first (or strongest) language, less skilled in Chinese (ranging from beginner to nearly bilingual)

3. Chinese Language and Literature + English Language B

Chinese first (or strongest) language, less skilled in English (ranging from beginner to intermediate)

4. English Language and Literature + Spanish Language B

Equally strong in English and Chinese, looking for an additional language option

5. English Language and Literature + English Language B (temporary)

ESOL student (Grade 5) or student new to English education
